Norrell Atkinson, MD, FAAP is Section Chief of the Child Protection Program at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia and an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at Drexel University College of Medicine. Dr. Atkinson is board certified in Pediatrics and Child Abuse Pediatrics. She completed her medical degree at Howard University College of Medicine, her Pediatric Residency training at Children's National Medical Center in Washington, DC and her subspecialty fellowship training in Child Abuse Pediatrics at Children's Hospital of the King's Daughter/Eastern Virginia School of Medicine. In addition to her clinical work, Dr. Atkinson also serves as the Educational Programming Chair for the AAP's Council on Child Abuse and Neglect. She has an interest in resident/medical student education and training of child welfare workers on recognition of child abuse.
