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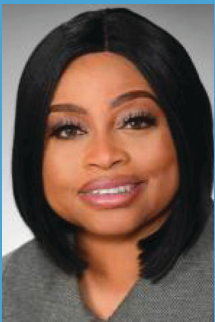

She is currently Assistant Professor in Psychiatry at Drexel College of Medicine and Assistant Professor at Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School division of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry where she previously served as Director of Pediatric Psychiatry Consultation Liaison Bristol-Myers Squibb Children's Hospital in New Jersey. Dr. Babalola was previously Medical Director of Emergency Psychiatry Service at Hackensack Meridian Hospital in New Jersey and Associate Program Director for the Child and Adolescent Program.
