Dr. Ana Radovic is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Pittsburgh. She is a pediatrician and subspecialist in Adolescent Medicine. Dr. Radovic completed her undergraduate and medical school at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio. She completed pediatrics residency and adolescent medicine fellowship at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center, and also received a Masters in Clinical Science at the University of Pittsburgh. Dr. Radovic's research focuses on how to use technology to improve mental health services for adolescents with symptoms of depression or anxiety.
